To remove the review of PROPOSED changes to town bylaws by an unelected committee and restore that review and decision to the town's voters at large. The newly named Town Bylaw Committee would still be enabled to review EXISTING bylaws but would only review a PROPOSED bylaw for consistency with federal, state, other local bylaws, and finally, for consistency within itself.

The measure would require that no person shall use more than one leaf blower on any lot of 6,000 square feet or smaller and that no person shall use a leaf blower that emits sound that measures greater than 65 decibels at a distance of 50 feet from the leaf blower.

Under this article, penalties shall include a written warning for the first violation, a fine of \$300 for the second violation and an additional fine of \$300 to be issued for each subsequent violation.

The fully effective date, after which no gas-powered leaf blowers may be used in Rockport, would be March 16, 2026, according to the measure.

To request the board to petition the state Legislature for a home rule exemption that would remove fluoride from the town's municipal water supply.

The article will ask voters whether they want the Select Board "to reduce environmental pollution and expenditures to the town by taking legislative steps to end fluoridation policy?"

Request a change to the Government & Bylaw Committee, the measure calls for the committee to hold a public hearing on any proposed changes to the bylaws. The article calls for the committee to be responsible for a five-year review of the bylaws.
